"What do we think about the virginity tests? Well we agree with that test. The purpose is for medical check-up. Our reproductive health is very important. In fact we agree so much that we fought for the test. The test should continue forever. The test shows that we as women can protect ourselves and therefore we are capable of protecting other people. If we are committed to be a policewoman we have to accept this rule. During training we will meet thousands of men and we have to know how to protect ourselves - you can imagine what could happen if we are in close proximity to a bunch of men.
