## **ACTIVITIES**

At a glance, during the first six months of 2015 the Indonesia Project was involved in many offshore activities, mainly in Indonesia, but also in the USA.

Our most recent activity, held in Indonesia in June for the third consecutive year, is the very popular <u>Hadi Soesastro Policy Forum (HSPF)</u>

The event takes the form of a lecture in honour of Hadi Soesastro, followed by the launching of the book from the previous year's Update Conference and a Mini Update. This year, Dr Stephen Grenville AO (Lowy Institute for International Policy) delivered the lecture on the topic, "Deepening the Indonesian Financial Sector" followed by the launch and discussion of the 2014 Update Book, *The Yudhoyono Presidency: Indonesia's decade of stability and stagnation* (editors: Edward Aspinall, Marcus Mietzner, Dirk Tomsa). A mini Update was then held on Indonesia's economic and political development. Dr Haryo Aswicahyono from CSIS delivered the economics update and Dr Dirk Tomsa the political update.

The lecture, book launch and Mini Update were held first on 10 June at the Centre for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS), Jakarta, followed by a repeat of the lecture in Surabaya hosted by Airlangga University and another launching of the book in Yogyakarta hosted by the University of Gadjah Mada (UGM).

These events attracted a large and enthusiastic audience and were well covered in the media.

The **9<sup>th</sup> Sadli Lecture** was held on 21 April 2015 at the Hotel Borobudur, Jakarta, with <u>Professor Ross Garnaut AO</u> as speaker on the topic of Indonesia's resources boom from an international perspective, examining the resulting policy dilemmas as well as options for sustained and equitable growth. The Lecture was attended by about 160 people (of which 63% were male) which was quite unexpected given that it was a busy week, with both the Asia Africa Conference and the World Economic Forum on East Asia convened in Jakarta at the same time.

The 2015 Indonesia-Australia High Level Policy Dialogue (HLPD) was held in Jakarta on March 25. Three key issues were discussed, namely regional fiscal transfers, social welfare policy, and global production networks.

On the local front, the Indonesia Project participated in the 'Indonesia Aid Investment Plan Consultation Forum' on 6 May 2015 at the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT). The forum was an opportunity for DFAT to seek advice from implementing partners to help shape the future direction of Australia's aid program in Indonesia. At the forum Hal Hill presented on 'Indonesia's economy: constraints and opportunities and its impact on Indonesia's development' whilst Robert Sparrow participated in the panel 'Human Development: Addressing Inequality and Vulnerabilities'.

Another very successful local event was held on 12 March 2015. **Dr Mari Pangestu**, Professor of International Economics at the University of Indonesia and Former Indonesian Minister of Tourism and Creative Economy, delivered **the Annual Harold Mitchell Development Policy Lecture** on the new economy and development: an Indonesian perspective. Held at the Molonglo Theatre, Crawford School of Public Policy, the event was attended by well over 200 people. This Public Lecture was presented by the Development Policy Centre at Crawford School of Public Policy, ANU in collaboration with the Indonesia Project and the Australian Indonesian Centre.
